CAMP RE-IMAGINED

A virtual summer camp experience from the

Girl Scouts of New Mexico Trails.

What is it?

Camp Re-Imagined is a way for us to connect with each other in a similar way like we would at camp!

During each activity block, the girls will get a chance to connect with each other through games, learn a new skill through live, guided activities, work on basic goal setting through Rose, Bud, Thorn, and meet staff from throughout council!

We will meet via Zoom three days a week (Tues, Weds, Thurs), once in the AM and once in the PM, for about 2 hours each time.

Each "week" of camp is \$30 for current Girl Scouts and \$35 for nonmembers.

Schedule

Activities within the blocks will be fully led by an adult and are divided by Girl Scout level to allow for us to tailor activities to younger or older girls. If a younger girl signs up for an older girl session it is likely she will need a parent's help to complete some activities.

Worried about missing a day? Don't be! Because there is a dedicated Google Classroom for each "week" of camp girls who are registered will be able to access the recorded videos for a few weeks after the session. PLEASE do not share this content with others until all summer sessions have ended.

Registration

There is a cap of 30 girls per "week". The cap may be extended after the first week of camp for following weeks.

Once you register, you will receive a confirmation email. We must receive your registration and payment **at least** one week in advance because of items that will need to be mailed.

On the Monday before your camp, you will receive an email with reminders and instructions on how to log in to the Zoom Room and the associated Google Classroom.

When not "at camp", girls will be able to share their CHALLENGE PROJECTS on the Google Classroom. Read on to learn more about activities by week and what a CHALLENGE PROJECT is!

A CHALLENGE PROJECT is an opportunity for girls to work on their own, or with a family member, to complete an extra project that they will share with the rest of the campers that week. An example of a project would be to continue a short story and share the finished project.

Once registered you will have access to digital copies of handouts, these will also be mailed in your weekly box. If you miss a class you will be able to see the handouts and review the recorded session; recordings will be uploaded 24-36 hours after the live program. Access to the Google Classroom and Drive with this info will continue until the middle of August.
