
## **Virtual Program – Outdoors**



Ways to Maintain Trails while hiking/backpacking:				
1.	Please don't take shortcuts.			
2.	Stay on the trail as much as possible.			
3.	Leave no trace rules apply.			
4.	Avoid hiking when it's muddy; if you do hike go <b>through</b> mud and puddles, and not around, to avoid			
	"trail braiding" (where one trails becomes several smaller trails).			

- 5. Don't make or take apart cairns (rock stacks).
- 6. No turd blossoms on the trail or next to it.
- 7. Carry a trash bag with you.
- 8. Move downed branches and other natural litter off the trail.
- 9. Know what's allowed and what's not on the trail.
- 10. Know who's responsible for the area.
- 11. Report trail blockages and problems.
- 12. Join your local trail organization.
- 13. If you MUST bring you dog, keep it on a leash.
