

Product Program Contactless & Limited Contact Recommendations

Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, we have remained focused on our #1 priority: keeping our Girl Scouts, their families, and our volunteers safe. We want to support you in all the ways you need to give your girls the lifelong benefits of the Girl Scout Leadership Experience. This includes having a safe and fun Product Program.

As we have seen all around us, everyone has a different idea and level of comfort regarding pandemic era activities. There is no one-answer-fits-all solution. We will continue to allow volunteers to use their best judgment for Product Program activities as long as they meet the state health orders. Here are some recommendations for picking-up product and money transactions with minimal or contactless interactions.

Drive Thru Pick-Up

Create drive thru pick-ups with social distancing. Schedule troops/families to arrive 15-20 minutes apart and presort product by troop/Girl Scout. Provide responsible adult with delivery document or send them document in advance. Girl Scout Volunteer will show responsible adult items and load in trunks. Families use their own pen and places document into a drop box/bin or they can take a photo of signed document and email to Girl Scout volunteer.

Porch/Drive Way Pick-ups Schedule troops/families to arrive 15-20 minutes apart and presort product by troop/Girl Scout. Leave product with delivery document on table on the porch or driveway. Families use their own pen and places delivery document into a drop box/bin.

Contactless Financial Transactions Research cashless transaction applications (Venmo, PayPal, Cheddar Up) that are best for your troop. Take into consideration fees since troops are responsible for any fees. Contact your local membership staff member about using these applications to collect money from

Ask families to bring their own pens to sign documents. Use hand sanitizer prior to and after any transactions.

If you are feeling sick at all, you should not participate in any Product Program activities.
