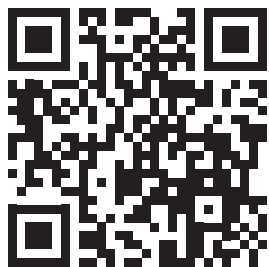

Log in to your MyGS account

Registration Guidelines & Deadlines

Ambassadors raise their voices to advocate for issues they care about. They actually move their dreams forward and learn that leaders aim for justice.

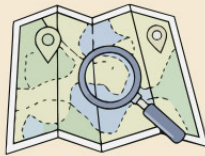
