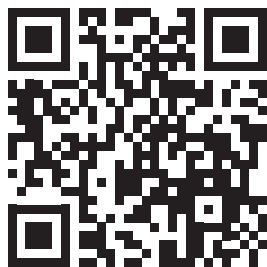

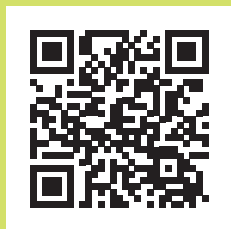

Registration Guidelines & Deadlines



Register as soon as registration opens—early registration allows our team to prepare appropriately for each participant's needs—from materials to supervision to program quality.
